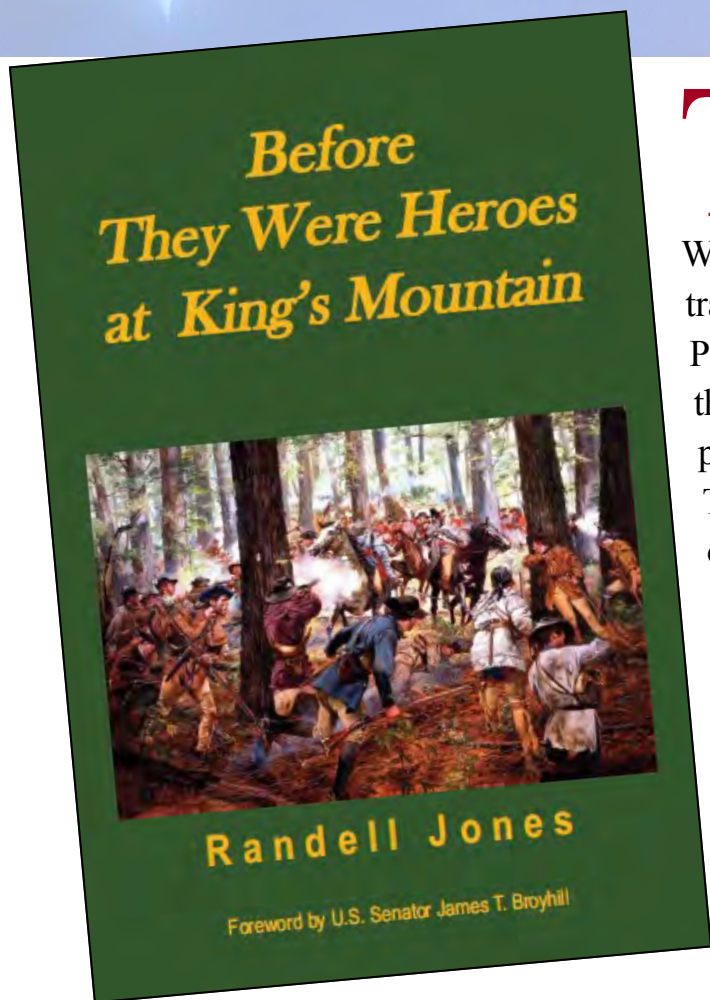


Before They Were Heroes at King's Mountain



The Battle of Kings Mountain on Oct. 7, 1780 was the “turning of the tide” in the American Revolution, a conflict between Americans — Whigs rebels from the backcountry against Loyalists trained as British forces. Major Patrick Ferguson’s arrogant threat stirred the passions of a people determined to live free. These “Tennesseans” marched over the Appalachians and helped defeat Ferguson’s army atop Little King’s Mountain. These Patriots were well experienced fighters through six years of conflicts with Shawnees, Cherokees, Chickamaugas, Scots Highlanders, Loyalist Tories, Royal grenadiers, robbers and thieves. These Patriots faced them all.
